16-25 Request to experiment with through lane bicycle box, City of South Pasadena

(Mike Sallaberry)

Ted Gerber, City of South Pasadena

Status Date 7/13/2023 - It is recommended that the experiment be closed and the markings left in place based on the final report, South Pasadena's desire to retain the markings and FHWA's Interim Approval 18.

Status Date - 01/23/23 - Public Works for the City of South Pasadena has provided a final report prepared by KOA Corporation in December of 2019. We are evaluating the report and its conclusions and will provide a recommendation at the May 2023 meeting. The City has indicated that they want to retain the markings at the close of the experiment.

Status Date -9/12/22 – Several contacts for this experiment are no longer working for City of South Pasadena. Tried to contact Sam Zneimer unsuccessfully on 9/8 as well as Planning Division on 9/12. Contacted Jason Welday, representative of LOCC Southern California, on 9/21/22, for assistance and he contacted the city on 9/22/22. Awaiting response from the city.





18-15 Request for experimentation with modified 4-section traffic control and (Jason Welday) R10-15b sign

Matthew Capuzzi, San Diego (Chen Ryan Associates)

Status Date -7/7/2023 – No change to status. See 9/2/22 update.

Status Date – 3/2/2023 – No change to status. See 9/2/22 update.

Status Date -9/2/2022 – The installation of equipment will take place in March 2025 and the experimentation period is from March 2025 to March 2026.

19-08 Request to Experiment Non-standard traffic control device for Highway 1 (Yue Wang) bus on Shoulder project

Sarah Christiansen, Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission

Status Date -7/19/23 – Phase 1 Construction is ongoing, phase 2 will start construction this fall. Phase 3 project is scheduled to finish PA/ED this fall.

Status Date -3/23/23 – Construction has started on phase 1 and phase 2 is out to bid.

Status Date – 12/15/22 – No change in status. See 10/24/2022 update.

Status Date -10/24/22 – The bus on shoulder facilities will be implemented in 3 phases on northbound and southbound Highway 1 and concurrently with 7.5 miles of auxiliary lane projects. For phase 1, the contract was awarded in August 2022 and construction is scheduled to begin in late 2022 and be operational by the end of 2024. For phase 2, construction is scheduled to begin in the summer of 2023 and will be operational in 2026. For phase 3, construction is expected to start in summer of 2025. The full 7.5-mile facility is anticipated to be operational in 2028.

19-11 Request to Experiment Red colored transit-only lanes

(Jason Welday)

Tim Frémaux, Los Angeles Department of Transportation

Status Date -7/12/23 – Still working on the procurement of materials.

Status Date -3/23/23 – LADOT received FHWA approval the week of March 19, 2023. In the process of ordering materials.

Status Date -7/5/22 – LADOT still waiting response from FHWA to continue with the expansion of the experiment.

Status Date -5/5/22 – LADOT proposed expanding its experiment with red colored transitonly lanes to determine if they continue to reduce violations of transit-only lane restrictions and reduce delays to transit vehicles at the CTCDC meeting on 5/5/22. CTCDC approved request to expand experiment to additional locations and 6-month time extension.





20-08 Request for experimentation with modified 4-section traffic control, 3- (Jason Welday) section bicycle traffic control, and modified R10-15b Sign

Ryan Whipple, P.E., T.E., City of Imperial Beach

Status Date -7/12/23 – Construction has begun on the entire project. Installation is expected to occur between April and October of 2024.

Status Date – 3/23/23 – Requested update. Have not received a response.

Status Date -1/13/23 – Contractor has been selected and awaiting permits to break ground. Work on selected locations is expected to begin late this year.

Status Date -10/6/22 – This experimental approval is part of a larger bikeway project led by regional Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG). The project was issued for Bid in May 2022. Contractor was selected August 2022. Notice to Proceed (NTP) for Construction will be November 2022.

20-09 Request for experimentation of the performance of Variable Speed Advisory (Yue Wang) (VSA) sign

Jose Camacho Jr., California Department of Transportation

Status Date - 7/12/23 - All signs were removed in April. They expect to complete the final report within the next couple of weeks.

Status Update - 3/22/23 - The signs will remain in the field until end of March 2023, planning on removal of the signs the first week in April 2023.

Data Analysis and Final Report writing will follow through the end of the project.

This Project is set to end at the end of May 2023. A Final Report is expected shortly after.

Status Update - 1/12/23 - Variable Speed Advisories Signs were installed at 10 locations along North Bound SR99. We are in the process of collecting data for analysis. The signs will be removed at the end of March 2023. The Project is expected to end at the end of May 2023 with a Final Report shortly after.

Status Date -10/7/20 – Caltrans DRISI was working with FHWA to check the status on Caltrans' request to get permission to experiment and evaluate the performance of Variable Speed Advisory (VSA) on State Route 99. Request was submitted on 7/27/20 and waiting response. Matthew Zeller of FHWA/Office of Operations confirmed that FHWA/ MUTCD Team had received the request for experimentation and will get back to Caltrans.





20-12 Request for approval of orange contrasted temporary pavement delineation in construction Zones

(Yue Wang)

Troy Bucko-Division of Safety Programs Brian Hadley, CE, Branch Chief Caltrans, District 11

Status Date - 7/12/23 - The request for the extension has been received by FHWA. Installation is anticipated in mid-August 2023.

Status Date -5/4/23 - The District is requested increasing the application to other stages and additional segments. The request included a time extension. The Committee approved the district request.

Status Date -11/10/22 – The District will submit a request to modify the experiment by increasing the application to other stages and segments of the project. The request will include a request for an extension of time for the conclusion of the experiment.

Status Date -9/26/22 – all the temporary orange striping is in place in "Unit 4," i.e., the zone planned for orange striping. All the cameras have been installed and configured by the UC Davis researchers, and they have collected about three months of data. Once the researchers have about a year's worth of data, they will analyze it and come up with some insightful, quantitative results about how driver behavior (e.g., speed, lane position, average number of lane departures, etc.), changed after standard white striping was replaced by the orange striping.

20-13 Request for approval of part-time travel on left shoulder

(Yue Wang)

Roger D. Barnes, Traffic Operations Branch Chief Caltrans, District 5 – San Luis Obispo

Status Date - 7/12/23 - RTL is still expected to be September of 2024. The project has been awarded significant funding from SB-1 funds.

Status Date - 3/22/23 - The project has completed the 30% construction review and the Ready to List Date is expected to be September 19, 2024.

Status Date - 12/15/22 - The Project is currently in design and has been renamed Five Cities Multimodal Transportation Network Enhancement Project due to multimodal elements added to the project, a park and ride (aka mobility hub), electrification of the hub with solar powered charging stations, a transit stop and parking stalls for the Pismo Preserves overflow parking.

Status Date -9/26/22 – The project has achieved signed PR and final PA&ED. The project had also completed its VA study as of the previous week. It's officially in the PS&E phase.





23-04 Request for Experiment for Left Turn Gates in the City of Los Angeles (K-line) (Robert Scharf)

Stephanie Leslie, Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority

Status Date - 7/13/23 - LACMTA has received approval from FHWA. Demolition for the first location has begun and anticipates installation is September 2023.

Status Date - 5/4/23 - The Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority presented a request to Place Left Turn Gates to supplement existing traffic signals in the City of Los Angeles. The Committee approved the experiment at the May 4, 2023 meeting.

23-05 Request for Experiment for Modified Detail 22

(Robert Bronkall)

Johannes Hoevertsz, Sonoma County Public Infrastructure

Status Date - 7/12/23 - The County is still working on the request for approval from FHWA.
