

Q&A: 7/29/2026 CRP Workshop #2

1. Are Project Alignment Confirmation (PAC) Forms required to match with the funding plan in the FTIP and the E76/3A?

Yes, the funding plan in the PAC Form shall match the funding plans included in the Request for Authorization (RFA) submittal package.

2. Given that PAC forms are required prior to programming, funding plans sometimes change by the time the E76 is prepared. What processes are available to reduce the time and resource needs for routing a new PAC form?

The following process may be used in lieu of routing a new PAC form when only minor changes are needed:

- Minor changes include, but not limited to, moving funds between phases or adjusting the amount of CRP on the project, as long as there is no change to the Scope of the project.
- Minor changes may be approved through markups on the PAC form by the CRP Program Manager, rather than preparing and routing a new form. Please reach out to the CRP inbox crp.hq.dla@dot.ca.gov to coordinate these markups with the CRP Program Manager and to determine if the change being requested qualifies as minor.
- Markups may be made in red text directly on the PAC form with the CRP Program Manager's signature or documented through an email to file to be attached to the PAC Form and included in the RFA Submittal package.
- If the CRP Program Team does not approve on the basis of a minor change, the Agency must then submit and route a new PAC form prior to E76 approval.

3. What are the available balances of the Y607 and Y608 Non-Urbanized Funds statewide?

Caltrans DLA tracks the available balances of Y607 and Y608 statewide and posts the running tally on the CRP website. This tally includes obligated projects utilizing these program codes, as well as approved PAC forms that have the Program Code Y607 or Y608 identified on it directly.

As of 8/4/2026, the available balance of Y607 has been depleted.

Moving forward, only Y608 Rural projects will be approved for non-urbanized funds.

4. What options are available to the regions with the recent depletion of Y607?

- Our CRP Team may be reaching out to some of the MPOs/RTPAs to discuss the potential use of Y608 funds in lieu of Y607 in full or in part, particularly for PAC forms that have recently been approved but funds have not yet been obligated yet.

- If you have an approved PAC form with the Program Code identified, your Y607 funds should already be captured in this balance and set aside for your project. If you are unsure, please contact our CRP Team to confirm.
- Timely obligation is crucial. If a project falls behind its obligation schedule and funds become at risk for lapsing or recission, those Y607 funds that were set aside may be redistributed to another project.
- If your region anticipates significant difficulty identifying rural projects, please reach out to us directly so we can discuss what options may be available.
- If you would like to have a project placed on a Y607 Small Urban Wait List, please email us with the project details. In the event that Y607 funds become available (due to reprogramming, deobligation, or with a looming lapsing funds or recission... etc), we will go down the wait list for projects to utilize the available Y607 balance first before opening it up Statewide.
